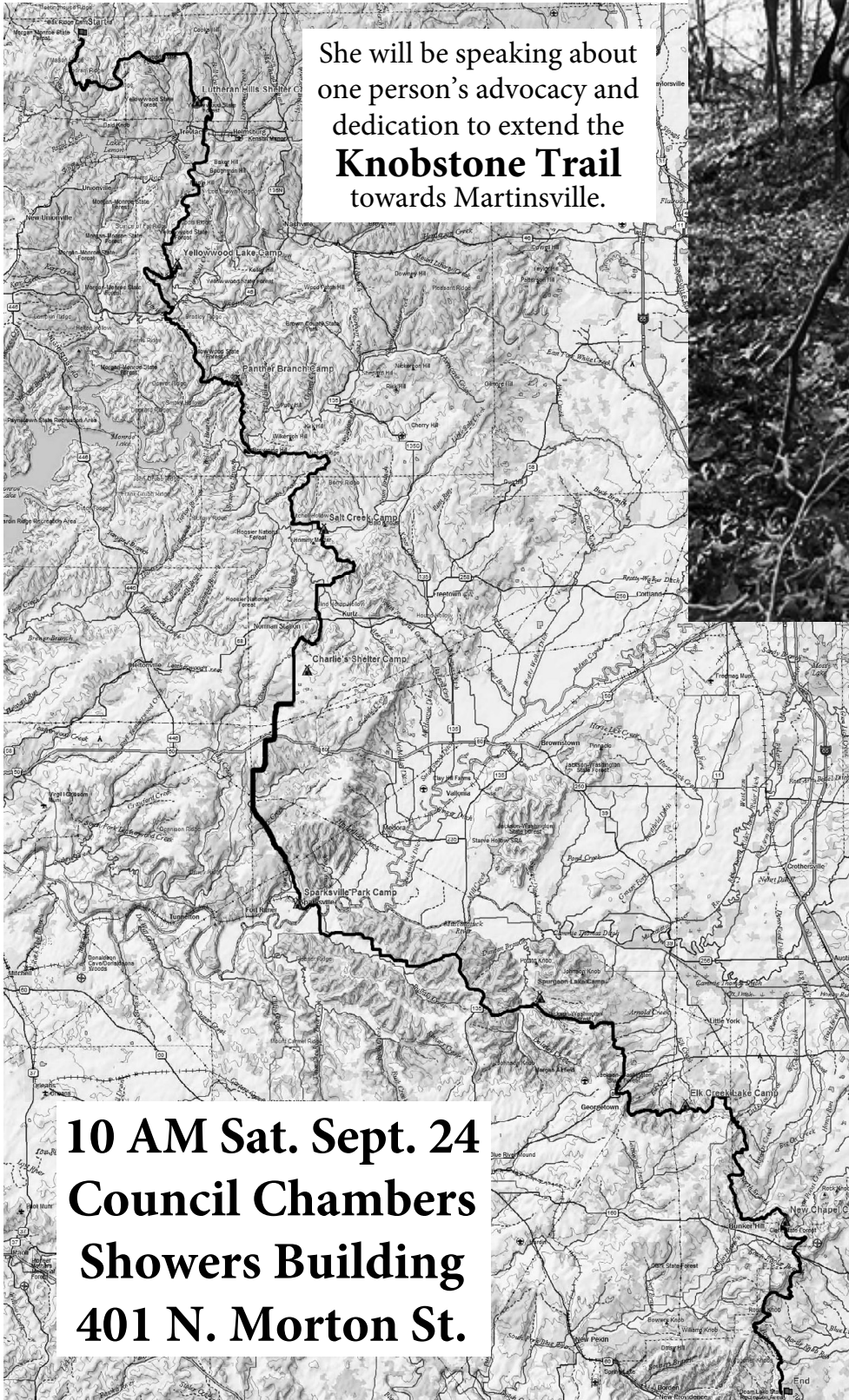
Livable Cities Speaker Series presents

She will be speaking about one person's advocacy and dedication to extend the **Knobstone Trail** towards Martinsville.



The Knobstone Trail was built in the 1980's as a 48 mile trail from Deam Lake to Spurgeon Hollow. The planned extension continues north through the Hoosier National Forest, Yellowwood and Morgan-Monroe State Forests for a total of 150 miles.

The HHC has built the Tecumseh Trail, the Leonard Springs Trail and the trail at the Tibetan Mongolian Cultural Center and rehabilitated trails in Yellowwood State Forest, Brown County State Park and Hoosier National Forest. HHC holds a workday the third Saturday of each month.
